# Annex 1 Mandatory Conditions

#### All Premises Licence authorising supply of alcohol

The licence is granted subject to the Mandatory conditions for sale of alcohol as set out in the Licensing Act 2003 as amended by the Licensing Act 2003 (Mandatory Licensing Conditions) Order 2010 and Order 2014.

1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the Premises Licence

- 5. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
  - (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licences must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
  - (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either:-
  - (a) a holographic mark or
  - (b) an ultraviolet feature.

any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and

2. The premises will operate a Think 25 policy. The checkouts will be programmed to prompt the checkout assistant when an alcohol product is scanned at the till to follow the Think 25 policy.

### Annex 3 Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority

(Consent Order Crawley Magistrates Court dated 18<sup>th</sup> October 2007)

- 1. Sight of evidence of age shall be required from any person appearing to those engaged in the selling or supplying alcohol to be under the age of 21 and who is attempting to buy alcohol.
- 2. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence from 18.00 to close of business on Thursdays, Fridays and Saturdays unless the Designated Premises Supervisor or other personal licence holder is present on the premises except where no such person is on the premises at these times due to emergency or unforeseen circumstances.
- 3. No Supply of alcohol may be made under the premises Licence at a time when there is no Designated Premises Supervisor who is a Designated Premises Supervisor in respect of these premises only.
